Come to church before 9:00 am. If you need a ride to church, let us know. We will return ALL the children to their HOMES at the end of the day, usually between 5:00 and 6:30 pm. If you want

your child dropped off at another location, be sure we know that, but you DO need to take your child back again! Food and drinks will be supplied and pictures taken. A donation of \$10.00 is appreciated. Also, if you can bring a back pack, it will help when we divide up the drinks and snacks, and will make it easier to carry home souvenirs. By the way, besides rocks, bones and shells, sometimes living creatures also find their way into the collections.
